### Plano High School Student Services

- Are trained to work with parents, students and other school staff members.
- Work with students individually and in groups to help resolve problems that interfere with learning.
- Support students with special needs and many serve as members of the child study team.
- Offer crisis intervention and prevention
- Maintain contact with and make appropriate referrals to various community agencies.
- Plan and coordinate school-wide programs for students and parents.

### School Guidance Counselors

Planning for the future is important for everyone. Here's what your student can do to prepare for the future:

- Become familiar with high school graduation requirements and college admission. Track credits closely during junior and senior years.
- Begin making plans for after high school (e.g. college visits, college athletic participation, and military opportunities).
- Explore career interests
- Plan to take elective courses that are related to interests and/or visit job sites
- Consider classes offered at Indian Valley Vocational Center
- Prepare for academic testing – MAP, PLAN, EXPLORE, PSAT, ACT
- Begin looking into available scholarships during junior and senior years.
